1972: GLENCARLYN LIBRARY'S FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY

The Glencarlyn Library was established in 1922 with funds and books bequeathed by Gen. Samuel S. Burdett.

Following Burdett's wishes, a white building was built on "The Reservation," a lot on So. Kensington Street at Third Street, So. This building served as the Library until 1962 when the present brick structure was constructed on the same site by Arlington County. The Glencarlyn Library became a branch of the Arlington County Public Library system in April, 1959.

1972: THIRTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF CORNERSTONE LAYING
